2.2. Project summary: what did you do?

The project seeks to help IDPs families focus on pregnant and lactating women (PLW) in the most vulnerable families in Sana'a Governorate, Hamedan District, Ablas Area in order to obtain integrated food and nutrition that enables them to resist the difficulties of life and maintain their health.

The project targets 130 pregnant and lactating women of IDPs families who belong to the most vulnerable families in the region and have been severely malnourished and insecure of food during pregnancy and lactation.

Beneficiaries: 130 IDPs Families equal to 910 individuals are severely malnourished pregnant and lactating women

The project targets Ablas area, which is the area separating Sana'a and the governorates of Amran and Al Mahwit from the west. The area experienced wide-spread displacement of many families from the conflict areas, especially from Al Hudaydah and Amran governorates. The area has also been witnessing urban expansion through random construction for the purpose of renting to the displaced. The area lacks a number of services. The most important of which is the absence of a government hospital or medical center despite the high population density, especially with the recent increase in the past five years. The area was not targeted by relief organizations which doubled the suffering of vulnerable groups in society, including pregnant and lactating women, most of whom were severely malnourished.

2.7. How exactly did your project benefit the local community?

The project aims at supporting pregnant and lactating women from the most vulnerable families in obtaining integrated healthy nutrition.

The project seek to enhance the targeted livelihood and improve their economic through secure the food for next six months for families who are food insecurity focusing on PLW to reduce the mortality among new born children and infants.

2.10. How did you monitor whether your aims and objectives have been achieved?

BACKGROUND

The project aim was to save lives and reduce mortality among new born and infants faced by famine affected resulted to the ongoing war, and armed conflict in Yemen, with the specific objective of meeting immediate food, WASH, nutrition, protection and shelter needs of vulnerable individuals in South, and north of Yemen. The evaluation covered two of grants nutrition and food security as integrated assistance.

DESIRED PROJECT RESULTS

This project was designed to achieve the following results:

1. Increased access to food assistance, nutrition and health services and improvement in health system practices.
2. Improved health and nutritional status of children, pregnant and lactating women.
3. Improved access to food for vulnerable and displaced-families.
4. Enhanced capacity of clinic staff for improved service delivery.

METHODOLOGY

The final evaluation utilized both quantitative and qualitative methods of data collection and employed a multi-pronged approach to ensure triangulation of the findings. Quantitative data was collected through a household questionnaire while the qualitative data was gathered through in-depth interviews, key informant interviews (KII) and beneficiary focus group discussions (FGDs). The beneficiaries interviewed in Ablas (nutrition, health services and foods) were those that benefitted from both nutrition and health services in clinic and food distribution.

FINDING

Project documents indicate that the project set out to improve health and nutrition status of children, Pregnant and Lactating Women. There was evidence that this had been achieved, although exclusive breastfeeding remained low with only 24% of mothers in Ablas reporting to have exclusively breastfed their children. However, 77.9% of new mothers reported having initiated breastfeeding within one hour after birth. This was a significant increase from the baseline figure of 32.3%. Findings also indicate that the project's quest to alleviate malnutrition lead to the achievement of the following prevalence levels with regard to the nutritional status of children in the survey area: SAM was reported to the Ministry of Public Health and Population, while the MAM prevalence was reported at 6.9% and this added up to GAM levels.

In comparison to the aforementioned, statistics obtained from the reports of a nutrition survey conducted in around Hamadan in December 2020 revealed that the SAM levels had declined to 1.6% while the GAM levels had gone down to 8.2%. This was a significant improvement considering that a similar survey carried out in December 2019 had indicated a grimmer situation where the SAM levels had been reported at 5.6% while the GAM levels stood at a high of 21.1%. This clearly indicates that there has been substantial improvement in the nutrition of children over the project period.

The rates the project under review's efforts in improving target communities' access to food as above average. This is informed by the fact that the findings indicate that a majority (50.3%) of the respondents across the program area received relief food during the project period. This compared impressively to a much lesser proportion of 4% reported during the baseline survey period. The fact that 46.3% of respondents were reportedly able to purchase their

Own food following project interventions denoted an improvement in life quality of the target beneficiaries since only a proportion of 4% made the same report during the baseline survey. The attributed this improvement to the fact that this could have been achieved courtesy of the food distribution initiatives which were reported to have benefitted at least 14.5% of the targeted households compared to 4% of those who benefitted from the same schemes during the baseline survey period. The SORD therefore concludes that this could be an indication of the ripple effect of increased income in a society where the benefits felt cascades down to other (indirect) beneficiaries and should be continued in future programming.

The SORD noted the project's success working towards alleviating some of the distress of displacement experienced by IDP households in Ablass by providing health, nutrition, food and NFIs assistances which benefitted an overall proportion of 62.6% of these households. These kits enabled beneficiaries to re-build their lives with nothing at all. This proportion was a considerable improvement from 4% of IDP households which received the same, earlier during the baseline survey.

Past SORD report had recommended that clinic staff be capacity built to improve their service delivery capability and the project took up this task putting in substantial effort to ensure that capacity of the team was enhanced with various trainings carried out and the desired outcomes witnessed by the improvement of various indicators across the project such as improved hygiene and sanitation awareness and IYCF package uptake among others.

CONCLUSION

The project increased access to Food assistances through to same community leading to improvement in livelihood and improving economic to increasing their income. The project also led to improved health and nutritional status of children including malnourished children <5 years, pregnant and lactating women through relevant trainings and provision of medication and food material. There was improved access to food for vulnerable and displaced families through food vouchers and direct food-stuff distribution to families by ACT supporting. Dignity of IDPs was improved through shelter, NFIs funded by othe partner (In Albas) and dignity kits provision. Capacity of local clinic staff for service delivery and local level emergency preparedness and response by SORD was strengthened through various trainings

LESSONS LEARNED AND RECOMMENDATIONS :

The activity is very simple to have such experience and feedback to improve our work in future but one thing we want to highlighting on it which is:

1. Strengthen coordination and contact between both of SORD & ACT to fine solution tom make the planned assistance meet the targeted beneficiaries need. Beside the fund shall be relieved in a proper time to do coordination with local authorities. We recommended SORD & ACT have to deliver this difficulties to ACT's donor when there are a plan to support Yemenis people in the North governorates of Yemen.

Note: we are seeking for online workshop with ACT to discuss the difficulties made by SCAMSH since 2020 as well as how to increase the fund to achieve more charities and support more affected people, beside discussion other relatives issue to improve our intervention and strengthen the partnership and work support

2.11. Do you have recommendations for future projects?

We recommended to do more efforts to help those families with food Baskets for the next six months. SORD will provide the requested Campaign Material to meet that in partnership with ACT. Beside that we hope form ACT in the next fund to send it in early time due to the process was made by SCAMSH which is complex and make coordination and implementation project more difficult in North of Yemen.

We recommended that to update ACT with actual needs of targeted people to fund a project that meet their needs and save their lives.

We recommended that clinic staff be capacity built to improve their service delivery capability and the project took up this task putting in substantial effort to ensure that capacity of the team was enhanced with various trainings carried out and the desired outcomes witnessed by the improvement of various indicators across the project such as improved hygiene and sanitation awareness and IYCF package uptake among others.

Abdullah has 23 old, works as a laborer carrying food bags in one of the food stores in the market near the village. He receives a daily wage that does not exceed half a dollar per hour. Abdullah has a family consisting of three boys and one girl and in addition to his three sisters and his mother, who works daily to provide and secure their needs of necessary live-saving to survive. Abdullah and his family live in a house that he rents for \$25 per month at the expense of another charitable man. Abdullah cannot pay the rent and bear the burden of family expenses.
